COURT REPORT

SENTENCES

The following sentences have been imposed in Umatilla County courts:

FELONY

•Austin Duane Dunham, 19, Umatilla, pleaded guilty to Assault III; sentenced to 3 years probation, 180 sanction units, 90 maximum jail units, and 80 hours community service, \$140 fine and \$800 fine-suspended, plus court costs and fees.

•Tyler Jonathan Hays, 19, College Place, Wash., pleaded guilty to Felon in Possession of Firearm; sentenced to 18 months Oregon Dept. of Corrections, 2 years post-prison supervision and \$140 fine, plus court assessment;
