

Pioneers reload for another run at state

It's no secret that the Pioneers have a huge hole to fill this season with the graduation of pitcher Colette Robert, who was named the state's Player of the Year at the Oregon Sports Awards as well as Pitcher of the Year in Class 4A after guiding the team to its second-straight state championships last season.

Coach Nicole Christian is hoping that fact will lead some teams to underestimate the potent mix of talent returning to the team this year.

"I think a lot of people think they're going to walk all over us

this year," she said. "I hope they do overlook us."

The Pioneers return six players that made all-state teams last season, and Christian said she likes their chances to make another deep playoff run, perhaps even win a third state title.

"That's the thing, we know everybody is gunning for us," she said. "Everybody thinks they can get us now that Colette is gone, but I don't think we're by any means out of the loop of getting back again."

Robert's production on the

rubber and at the plate isn't something the team can replace with one player, but with strong defense, the quickest roster Christian has coached in her eight seasons, and plenty of capable hitters, the Pioneers believe they can find plenty of ways to keep the wins coming at a rapid pace.

Junior Mallory Copeland, an all-state catcher last season, will step out in the field and toe the rubber this season.

"Her passion is behind the plate but she also knows that she

wants to do her best for the team wherever we put her," Christian said. "She's been working really hard in the offseason on the mound and she's been working in the cages and getting better."

"She's ready to go. She's just gotten better since the last time I saw her."

The team had several younger players that are vying for innings in the circle as well, and all of them will be backed by a defense Christian expects to be one of the team's biggest strengths once she

figures who will play where.

"We've got a lot of things that we have options of trying, which I love because these kids are so versatile," she said. "Defensively we match up well and it's going to be whoever can hit the ball well the stays in the lineup."

"I have so many options and it's going to be tough to figure out what's going to work for us, and who's going to rise to the pressure. I don't think we're too far off talent-wise knowing that we came get back (to state)."

The rest of the lineup is little more murky, but Michaud said he likes the talent he's got and it's just a matter of putting everybody in the position they'll best serve the team.

"I'm excited to get this year going," he said. "I'm excited for this opportunity and excited to see the kids grow."

Milleson expects his throwers to be a primary strength for both teams, and hopes an influx of quick athletes can help make the girls into a well-rounded squad.

"We're hoping those young kids learn fast because we've got some good ones out here, and they're going to be making our returners earn their keep for sure," he said. "Sophomores and juniors, they just came out of the woodwork this year."

The boys' team has even more learning curves to navigate, though.

"The boys' side is pretty wide open," Milleson said. "We've lost a lot of guys to graduation the last couple years so we're hurting."
