Armed robbery suspect sentenced to 70 months

The 24-year-old who robbed Stanfield's Center Market at gunpoint has been sentenced to 70 months in prison.
 Judge Daniel J. Hill on May 10 sentenced Alfredo Lopez Rodriguez, 24, to 70 months in prison with no possibility for early release after the Hermiston man pleaded guilty to second-degree robbery and coercion.
 At 2 a.m. on Dec. 6,

2016, a man, later identified as Rodriguez, entered Center Market in Stanfield with his face covered by a bandana, according to a press release from the Umatilla County District Attorney's Office. The man demanded the store clerk give him all the money in the cash register — \$379 — while pointing a handgun at the clerk. After receiving the money, Rodriguez held the gun to

the clerk's head and forced the clerk outside. Rodriguez then fled.
 Rodriguez was booked into the Umatilla County Jail on Dec. 15, 2015, on a total bail of \$113,000.
 A Umatilla County Grand Jury indicted Rodriguez for first-degree robbery, second-degree robbery, coercion, unlawful use of a firearm, menacing and second-degree theft.
