# Armed robbery suspect sentenced to 70 months

The 24-year-old who robbed Stanfield's Center Market at gunpoint has been sentenced to 70 months in prison.

Judge Daniel J. Hill on May 10 sentenced Alfredo Lopez Rodriguez, 24, to 70 months in prison with no possibility for early release after the Hermiston man pleaded guilty to second-degree robbery and coercion.

At 2 a.m. on Dec. 6,

as Rodriguez, entered Center Market in Stanfield with his face covered by a bandana, according to a press release from the Umatilla County District Attorney's Office. The man demanded the store clerk give him all the money in the cash register — \$379 — while pointing a handgun at the clerk. After receiving the money, Rodriguez held the gun to

2016, a man, later identified the clerk's head and forced the clerk outside. Rodriguez then fled.

> Rodriguez was booked into the Umatilla County Jail on Dec. 15, 2015, on a total bail of \$113,000.

> A Umatilla County Grand Jury indicted Rodriguez for first-degree robbery, second-degree robbery, coercion, unlawful use of a firearm, menacing and second-degree theft.

# Idaho teen arrested in stabbing **Boardman rest stop restroom**

A 17-year-old Idaho male stabbed a woman Saturday in a woman's restroom at a rest stop near Boardman.

Oregon State Police Sgt. Tom Spicknall said the woman's injuries were not life-threatening and police arrested the teen and booked him into the juvenile facility at the Northern Oregon Regional Correctional Facilities, The Dalles.

The case is an active investigation, Spicknall said, so he could not release many details. Court records identify the suspect as Talon James Davis of Clarkston, Idaho, and he turns 18 in June.

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office confirmed a 9-1-1 call at 3:44 p.m. reported the attack in the restroom at the state rest stop off the westbound side of Interstate 84 near milepost 161, just outside Boardman. Spicknall said the teen used a knife, and an ambulance took the victim, Sandra Byers, 51, to Good Shepherd Medical Center, Hermiston.

Good Shepherd spokesman Nick Bejarano said the hospital released Byers on Monday morning.

Spiknall, who heads up the state police criminal division out of Pendleton, said most assault victims know their assailant or they at least have some association. But that does not seem to be the case here, he said, as Davis and Byers had no interaction prior to the stabbing.

Morrow County District Attorney Justin Nelson charged Davis on Monday with first-degree assault and unlawful use of a weapon. Circuit Judge Eva Temple set Davis' bail at \$100,000.

Nelson said he is charging Davis as an adult. He said he would present evidence to a grand jury Wednesday and arraign the teen Thursday.
