That led to a warrant for his arrest, which the sheriff's office fulfilled Sunday. Second-degree rape carries a mandatory minimum sentence in Oregon of six years, three months under Measure 11. The state arraigned Martin on the charge Monday. Martin remains in the Umatilla County Jail, Pendleton, in lieu of \$50,000 bail. His next court hearing is Aug. 18.
