Umatilla School District places bond for \$10.5 million on November ballot

Umatilla voters will be asked to consider a \$10.5 million school bond in November

If voters approve the bond the Umatilla School District will also receive \$4 million in matching state funds from the Oregon School Capital Improvement Matching Program.

At all three schools in the district the funds would pay for roof replacements, entry and office remodeling to increase security, direct digital controls for the HVAC systems and security updates such as cameras and lock-down assistance.

The funds would also pay for additional space to be added on to Mc-Nary Heights Elementary School, a cooling tower replacement at Umatilla High School and plumbing, electrical, HVAC, window, flooring and bleacher replacement at Clara

Brownell Middle School.

The bond package was put together after the school district contracted with the Wenaha Group to conduct a facility study and create a long-term facility plan. The study is available for review at the school district office, 1001 Sixth Street in Umatilla.

The district is holding public bond information meetings and tours of the school buildings starting at Clara Brownell Middle School at 7 p.m. every Tuesday in September.

"We want to give our community many opportunities to learn all they can about our current school facilities and what the bond can accomplish, if it passes," Superintendent Heidi Sipe said in a news release. "We are excited to share our vision and plans.'


