vantage of several Hermiston mistakes, including a pair of interceptions by James, one of which was returned 85 yards for a touchdown by Union's Lincoln Victor to give the Titans a 13-7 lead in the second quarter.

Hermiston's defense struggled to contain the Titans offensive weapons over the middle quarters, as numerous missed tackles and blown coverages led to several Titan big plays and touchdowns. Ena said that it was overall a frustrating game for the Bulldog D.

(Union) just kept running it and we were struggling on tackling," he said. "We weren't reading as fast as we needed to and we were just losing intensity."

One of the backbreak-

ing moments for the Bulldog defense came late in the second quarter, trailing 13-7 with 1:46 left in the half. The Bulldogs had forced the Titans into a 3rd and 23 situation from its own 20 yard line when the Titans ran a simple draw play with running back Elijah Jones who broke a few Bulldog tacklers and scampered 41 yards to the Bulldog 39. The play eventually led to a Union touchdown that gave the Titans a 20-7 lead at the half.

Union racked up 335 yards of total offense against Hermiston, with quarterback Victor completing 12-18 passes for 114 yards and a touchdown while Siofele ran for 83 yards on eight carries with two touchdowns.

Hermiston next plays at Lewiston (ID) on Friday at 7 p.m.

where Stanfield has set its bar. Playing the underdog role last season, the Tigers made it all the way to the 2A semifinals before losing to Kennedy 34-20. The hype has been building around this team ever since. Now they're intent on proving 2015 wasn't a fluke.

"Last year we kind of came out of nowhere," Salas said. "This year no one is going to hand us anything. I told my kids in the locker room, 'Nobody fears Stanfield football and that's gotta change.' When we come out here we have to punish teams and send a message."

Justin Keeney responded to Salas' message. The junior lined up at linebacker, cornerback and rover, spelling Monkus when he needed a breather. Besides flying to the ball with timely tackling, Keeney picked off Olsen in the third quarter, quickly halting an Enterprise drive.

"You can put him anywhere, he's such a smart kid," Salas said. "... He's just a football junkie. He loves football, he loves to learn, and like I said, put him anywhere and he'll give you 100 percent."

Stanfield's offensive gameplan was altered as a result of senior quarterback Dylan Grogan missing the game with a hip pointer, which he suffered in the team's blue-and-gold scrimmage a week earlier. Junior Shayne Keltz started in his place, mostly playing a facilitator role.

Besides a couple quarterback keepers up the middle of the defense, Keltz had

his choice of Tigers running backs to lean on. Monkus led the team with 192 rushing yards and two touchdowns, but was also complemented by Adrian Renner's 143 yards on 11 rushes and Keeney's 54 yards.

"They played awesome," senior offensive guard Jose Garcia said. "Thyler ran hard. Adrian, who stepped up and came out this year, ran hard too ... All the running backs did a great job today."

Keltz didn't attempt a pass until the third quarter when he hit Justin Shelby for 11 yards on fourth down.

"When you have a senior group and a new, raw quarterback you want to just let him ease into it a little bit," Salas said.

Salas expects Grogan to return for next week's non-conference home game against Cascade.

"He'll be back next week and he'll be at full strength," Salas said. "Hopefully we'll keep getting better from here on out."
