Even after their children had grown, several generations of children would come to look at the big tree and ask to play basketball. She would put everyone else's needs before hers. When a family member suffered major medical issues she would take on the important tasks even as she was facing medical problems herself. She knew how to reach out to people,

love people and help them succeed.

Beverly loved all of the holidays — the gathering of loved ones at Christmas and Thanksgiving, then the glorious fireworks on the 4th of July.

One of Beverly's favorite hobbies was collecting turtle figurines.

When the internet came along she liked to watch webcams streaming video from places like Waikiki Beach in Hawaii, Nassau in the Bahamas and other exotic locations.

She was a proud Democrat and was so proud of the fact that Hillary Clinton was running for president of the United States. Beverly was a peacemaker, a lover, a dreamer. She will always be cherished by all who knew and loved her.
