

Fire in Stanfield nearly burns house

A field fire engulfed several pieces of equipment and nearly burned a home and in Stanfield on Monday afternoon. Crews responded to the blaze in a field off East Harding and North Wayne streets a little before 4 p.m., and were able to stop it from affecting

the home near where it started.

Adrian Montoa, who lives in a home on North Wayne Street that was closest to the fire, said the flames almost got his house.

"I was just sitting in my computer room, and saw the fire out my window," he said, adding that it burned the bushes near his house.

Up the hill in a field, several pieces of farm equipment were engulfed in the flames, which sent a cloud of black smoke over the area for about 20 minutes. Firefighters had the blaze under control by about 4:20 p.m.

The cause of the fire is unknown at this time.

Prison inmate dies Saturday

An inmate at Two Rivers Correctional Institution in Umatilla died unexpectedly Saturday night.

Benjamin Yzaguirre, 64, was found unresponsive in his cell around 9:39 p.m. Security, medical staff and Umatilla Emergency Medical technicians administered life-saving efforts, but were unsuccessful. Yzaguirre was taken to a local

hospital and pronounced dead at 10:55 p.m.

Yzaguirre has been in the Department of Corrections' custody since July 2015, on rape and sodomy charges. He was expected to be released in June 2021.

The Department of Corrections released no other information about the cause of death. The Oregon State Police Criminal Investigation Team is conducting an investigation.
