SENTENCES

Two arrested in metal theft from local business

The Hermiston Police Department responded to the Good Shepherd Medical Center about 4 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 10, on a report of an attempted theft that had just occurred.

Sgt. Chris Martin met with security staff from Good Shepherd Medical Center and was able to review surveillance footage that showed a male and female attempting to steal two spools of high voltage copper wire from inside a storage room. The wire was valued at about \$2,000. The male and female were interrupted by a

roaming security employee on the hospital campus and fled in a Suzuki SUV.

Martin shared the video surveillance a couple of hours later during a briefing for the oncoming shift.

Based on the vehicle and video information, the suspects were tentatively identified.

Umatilla County Undersheriff Jim Littlefield said around 5:45 p.m. the same day, the sheriff's office had a report of a theft in progress at Bruce Heating and Air Conditioning, off Highway 395 and East Punkin Center Road.

A witness told a sheriff's deputy they saw a man and woman stealing metal from behind the business.

Around 6:40 p.m., Sgt. Kelly Parsons of the Hermiston Police Department conducted a traffic stop in the 400 block of Southeast 10th Street on an older Chevrolet S10 pickup matching the description from the UCSO incident.

Littlefield said the two people in the vehicle were in possession in some of the stolen items and admitted to stealing them.

The suspects, Jonathan Price, 35, of Hermiston,

and Maria Martinez, 34, of Irrigon, were taken into custody and later charged and lodged on one count of second-degree burglary and one count of first-degree theft.

They will also be charged with first-degree theft and criminal mischief, criminal trespassing and second-degree burglary by the Umatilla County Sheriff's Office.

The Umatilla Police Department provided assistance in this investigation as the duo was believed to be staying at a motel in that city.

Riverside goes into half-hour lockout

A miscommunication led to a Boardman school lockout Monday.

According to a Morrow County School District press release, Riverside Junior/Senior High School locked its doors from 11:24 a.m. to 11:58 a.m. while the Boardman Police Department responded to an incident in the area.

Boardman Police Chief

Rick Stokoe said a school staff member had a conversation with a parent Monday morning where the staff member heard the parent saying he was going to "shoot" the school.

As the school was put on lockout, the police spoke with the parent, who told authorities that he had said he was going to "sue" the school and not shoot it. Once police determined that the school wasn't under threat, Riverside lifted the lockout.

Under the lockout procedure, a school's outside doors are locked while students and staff maintain normal business.

Man drowns Saturday at Warehouse Beach

The Umatilla County Sheriff's Office reported a drowning Saturday at Warehouse Beach.

Deputies responded to the area Saturday at 6 p.m., according to a statement the sheriff's office issued

Monday, on a report that a male swam away from the shore, began to struggle, went under and did not resurface.

Deputies conducted an initial search, then requested assistance from the Columbia Basin Dive Rescue team based in Richland, Washington.

The dive team found the man about 8 p.m. The sheriff's office also stated it would not release the identity of victim until notifying his family.
