Jessie B. (Tibbs) Tarter died peacefully in her sleep on November 18, 2017, in Hermiston, Oregon, at the age of 96.

Jesse was born on January 19, 1921, in Baker City, Oregon, to James and Martha Tibbs. She graduated from high school in Haines, Oregon, in 1939 and later with a degree as a beautician in La Grande, Oregon.

She married Donald Tarter in Weiser, Idaho, on August 6, 1941, and during World War II they moved to Vancouver, Washington, where Donald built war ships. After the war they returned to Eastern Oregon where they farmed and ranched in the Baker Valley. They moved to Stanfield in 1953, where Don-

ald began working for Union Pacific Railroad and Jesse ran the farm. Her children remember her making cream to sell to Mayflower milk in Hermiston.

In the mid-1960s her mother Martha bought her one weaner pig. Jesse raised it, had it bred and sold a litter of weaner pigs. That is how she bought the family their first color TV.

Jesse was an accomplished baker and often her pies, Christmas candies and cookies were in high demand. She was a warm and loving individual who loved nothing more than her family. Any family get-together with children around her would bring a smile to her face. She liked watching the Seahawks and bull riding. The only time she might get slightly upset with a stray great- or great-great-grandchild was when she was watching either and they would wander in front of the TV.

SENTENCES

The following sentences have been imposed in Umatilla County:

FELONY

•Marvin Lewis Strickland, 38, Boardman, pleaded guilty to Possession of Methamphetamine: sentenced to 3 months jail, 1 year post-prison supervision and 6 months driver's license suspension.

•Vanessa Ashley Dunmeyer, 26, Hermiston, pleaded not guilty to Possession of Methamphetamine: sentenced to 18 months probation, 90 sanction units, 30 maximum jail units and 80 hours community service (conditional discharge).
