# Mail theft hits near Hermiston

The Umatilla County Sheriff's Office reported at least 40 Hermiston-area residents are the victims of recent mail theft.

The case began Dec. 5, according to the sheriff's office, when deputy Calvin Meade responded to a call regarding a report of mail all over the ground in the area of North Ott and East Loop roads, Hermiston.

"The mail included several envelopes that had been opened, including holiday cards with empty contents and checks," the sheriff's office reported.

Three Hermiston-area callers on Dec. 15 reported finding mail in the area of Sagebrush Road, Baggett Lane, Alpine Drive and Klaus Road east of Hermiston. They also found mail in other areas east of the town, including on East Punkin Center and Tabor roads, East Theater Lane between Northeast 10th Street and Townsend Road, and Sagebrush and North Townsend

Meade determined at least 40 people were victims of mail theft. The sheriff's office notified each as well as the postmaster in Hermiston. The post office will redeliver the mail to the victims, according to the sheriff's office.

The sheriff's office warned residents to be on the lookout for suspicious persons in the areas east of Hermiston and asked anyone with information regarding the mail theft to call the agency at 541-966-3651.
