**Joan Marie Sharp Frischmuth**

Joan Marie Sharp Frischmuth was 101 when she passed in McMinnville, Ore., on April 16, 2018. She was born on March 23, 1917, in The Dalles, Ore., the oldest of Arthur J. Sharp and Eunice Codd Sharp's four children.

Joan grew up on a cattle and wheat ranch in The Dalles, where she still owns. Joan attended St. Mary's in The Dalles, graduated from St. Mary's Academy in Portland and attended Marylhurst College. She married Henry Frischmuth in 1946 and had five children, moving from The Dalles to Hermiston, then McMinnville.

Joan was a skilled artist, working for photographic studios retouching and hand coloring photographs. She was an outstanding seamstress, designing clothes for dancers, weddings, schools and the Catholic church. Her fashions were nationally published, and tal-

ents included painting and stained glass.

Joan was proud of her family's pioneering history. Her grandfather was a surveyor in Wasco County and did much of the work on the road from The Dalles to Portland. Her father played football with Knute Rockney at Notre Dame and was a successful rancher in The Dalles. The Sharp family lineage is traced to the Pilgrims. Joan was proud of her children's achievements and their philanthropy.

She is survived by her sister Kathleen Sharp Mitchell, Seattle; children Phillip Frischmuth, Patrick Frischmuth, Paula Frischmuth Miller and Pam Frischmuth Fecher; nine grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by husband Henry Phillip Frischmuth, and daughter Peggi Frischmuth Roskens.

Gerald R. "Joe" Proebstel of Stanfield, Oregon, was born on January 23, 1935, in Orchards, Washington, to parents Ellis and Elizabeth Dubach Proebstel. He died on April 19, 2018, in Walla Walla, Washington, at the age of 83 years.

Joe was raised in the Portland, Oregon, area before joining the United States Navy. He served during Korea and after a 28-year career he retired as a chief hull tech. While in the Navy Joe served on several vessels and bases, including the USS Los Angeles (CA-135), USS Naval Station in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, USS Naval Air Training Command in Kingsville, Texas, USS Fulton AS11, New London, Conn., USS Simon Lake Plank owner Scotland, USS Ashland LSD, Norfolk, Va., Naval and active ship maintenance facility, Bremerton, Washington, and was stationed at the Naval base in San Diego, California. He was a member of Seabee 10 in Port Hueneme, California, where he was chosen to serve with a select team in Palau.

Joe was united in marriage to Patricia G. Ross on September 15, 1955, in West Linn, Oregon. After Joe retired from the Navy, they lived in Parkdale, Oregon, from 1978 until moving to Stanfield, Oregon, in 1983 where they have lived since.

Joe worked as a mechanic for Lamb Weston until he retired in 2000. He was a member of the VFW, American Legion and Fleet Reserves. Joe enjoyed hunting, fishing, camping, his hobby farm, playing cards and watching horse racing. He cherished spending time with his grandchildren at their sporting events and other activities.

He is survived by his wife, Pat Proebstel, Stanfield, Ore.; daughters Gayle Hamner (Rex), Pinedale, Wyo., Carolyn Papineau (Jay), Lexington, Ore., and Janet Herbes (Mike), Union, Ore.; sons James Proebstel (Cindy), Portland, Ore., and Bill Escobar (Laura), Camarillo, Calif.; 14 grandchildren; 14 great-grandchildren; and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.
