- SAME DAY ENTRIES MUST PAY FEES & FILL OUT AN ENTRY FORM <u>AT THE FAIR OFFICE</u> TO RECEIVE STALL CARD
- All entry forms MUST be turned into the Fair Office. They will not be accepted in the barn.
- The jackpot consists of the entry fees and matching sponsor money, after administrative expenses are deducted. Carcass Data will be Collected Upon Processing.

DIVISION: JACKPOT LAMB CONTEST

Class 100: Resale- (All lambs will be purchased and processed by <u>Kalapooia Valley Grass Fed Processing LLC</u>. in Brownsville, OR.)

All lambs will be transported for processing on Sunday

RULES:

- 1. Entry Fee: \$25 per head (REMIT TO UCF. PAY AT FAIR OFFICE)
- 2. Phase A: Live placing 40% of jackpot & Phase B: Carcass placing 60% of jackpot.
- 3. Entry limit 2 lambs, either male or female, any breed or crossbreed.
- 4. Market lambs will be weighed & ear tagged after arrival.
- 5. Any lamb found to be a yearling in Phase A or B will be disqualified.
- 6. Cryptorchid and ram lambs will be disqualified.
- 7. All lambs entered in Phase A will compete in Phase B.
- 8. All lambs will be harvested by buyer.
- 9. Market lambs will be judged according to the board posted in the barn. Handlers will be provided and owners must remain outside of the show ring.
- 10. The carcass placing will be on an adjusted Yield Grade. Visit www.umatillacountyfair.net for complete carcass judging criteria listed under "Exhibitors".
- 11. Jackpot winnings and buyer payment will be paid via check from Umatilla County after carcass data has been received.

NOTE: Until the palatability and tenderness of Callipyge (heavy muscled) lamb is determined, they will not be accepted for the Jackpot Contest.

Premium: Jackpot Award will be divided as follows:

A. Live Placing – 40% of the jackpot B. Carcass Evaluation – 60% of jackpot

If <u>20 lambs or **LESS**</u> are entered, the jackpot money will be divided amongst the top three lambs in each phase of the competition in the following amounts:

1st place:50% 2nd place:30% 3rd place: 20%

If <u>OVER20</u> lambs or more are entered, the money will be divided amongst the top five lambs in each phase of competition in the following amounts:

1st place:40% 2nd place:30% 3rd place:15% 4th place:10% 5th place:5%
