Umatilla man sentenced for strangling victim near children

Umatilla man sentenced May 28 to time served, having already served 22 months in custody, plus three years supervised release for strangling his significant other in the presence of their four children.

According to court documents, Joel Malcom Salt, 29, a Navajo Indian, violated a tribal protective order in April 2017, by going to the crime victim's house. The woman is an enrolled member of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, who lives on the reservation with their four count indictment in June children.

When Salt arrived at the house, he grabbed the victim by her hair, threw her to the ground in front of their children and dragged her to the bedroom. Once in the bedroom, Salt pinned the victim to the floor, punched her and strangled her, causing her to lose consciousness several times.

To divert his attention, the woman told Salt their children probably left the house to tell her father, who lived next door. When Salt went to check, she escaped out a window.

A federal grand jury in Portland returned a one2017, charging Salt with assault by strangulation. He pleaded guilty to the charge in November 2018.

During sentencing, U.S. District Court Judge Anna J. Brown ordered Salt to attend an intensive batterer's intervention program and to undergo substance abuse and mental health treatment. Among other conditions of supervision, Salt is prohibited from entering the Umatilla Indian Reservation or contacting the woman and their children without advance approval of his probation officer and notice to the United States Attorney's Office.


