
Judith Helen Kurtz of Hermiston was born August 16, 1939, in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, the daughter of Andrew and Frances

She was preceded in death by her daughter, Cynthia; her parents; nine and a siblings; great-granddaughter, EmmaLee.


She is survived by a son, Chris (Myla) Kurtz; three grandchil-
