Lindsey Llaneza, 65, passed away in the infirmary at TRCI.

Llaneza entered DOC custody on April 15, 2004, from Multnomah County

Robert Jones, 71, passed away in the infirmary on July 2.

Jones entered DOC custody on October 30, 2008, from Clackamas County with an earliest release date of January 29, 2023.

TRCI is a multi-custody prison in Umatilla that houses approximately 1,800 adults in custody.
