The Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs and Oregon Health Authority are interested in feedback in regards to the study's findings and further recommendations. Veterans and their family members, those currently serving in the military as well as healthcare providers and policymakers are encouraged to attend an upcoming gathering to share their thoughts.

U.S. Cellular dials into youth programs

Walden seeks input for service academy nominations

Rep. Greg Walden, R-Hood River, encourages Oregon students who are interested in attending one of the United States service academies to apply for an official nomination through his office.

Each year, students from across Oregon's Second District are nominated for acceptance to the service academies after being recommended by Walden's Service Academy Nomination Board, which includes active and retired military officers. They will interview potential candidates and make recommendations based on each student's academic performance, extracurricular involvement and character.

The service academies available for nominations from members of Congress include the Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado; the Military Academy at West Point, New York; the Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland; and the Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point, New York. The U.S. Coast Guard Academy in New London, Connecticut, does not require a congressional nomination for appointment.

Nomination applications must be submitted by the end of October and can be completed at [www.walden.house.gov/academynominations](http://www.walden.house.gov/academynominations).

Walden's formal nominations will be announced in late December. Final admission selections will be determined by officials at each academy in early spring.

Hermiston to host ag summit in October

Water rights and environmental due diligence in real estate transactions will be among the topics regional water experts and attorneys cover at Dunn Carney's annual Eastern Oregon Ag Summit.

The event is scheduled from 7:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 15, at the Maxwell Event Center, 145 N 1st Place, Hermiston.

The free, half-day conference will feature a range of speakers focusing on state and regional water, labor and intellectual property laws and issues in agriculture. Tom Myrum, executive director of the Washington State Water Resources Association, will provide an update on the Columbia River Treaty Negotiations. Dunn Carney's East-

ern Oregon Ag Summit includes panel discussions and presentations by industry leaders from around the region, as well as lawyers from law firm Dunn Carney's Agriculture and Natural Resources Team.

"This is a unique opportunity for farmers, ranchers and processors in the region to hear directly from industry and organization leaders who have a seat at the table in dealing with issues that affect them," says Kate Moore, leader of Dunn Carney's environmental practice and chair of the firm's Eastern Oregon Ag Summit. "We want attendees to ask questions and talk with each other and with us."
