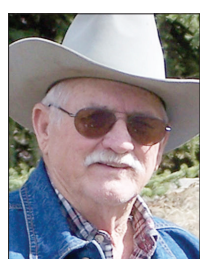

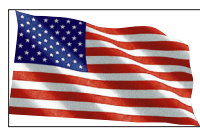
He was a member of the Elks Club, Blue Mt. Paint Horse Club, Over the Hills trail riding club, and retired from Oregon State Highway Department.

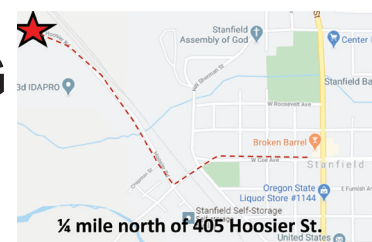
