A GRANDE — An outdoor ■after-school program this fall will use art and science to guide middle school students in discovering the stories of nature and themselves.

Discover After School — a

collaboration between Art Center East and the La Grande Parks and Recreation Department — runs Sept. 16 to Oct. 21, offering free weekly field trips to Riverside Park and Pete's Pond, where middle schoolers will choose activities such as sculpting, journaling and scientific explorations.

Participants in Discover After School will visit the neighborhood parks on Thursdays from 3:30-5:30 p.m. Parks and Rec will provide transportation to Riverside Park, and Pete's Pond is a 1-mile walk from La Grande Middle School. The site is subject to change due to inclement weather or the accessibility needs of the group. Youth may get dirty and/or get paint on

their clothes, and masks will be required.

Art Center East encourages middle schoolers to "sign up today and discover our own stories and nature's stories from new perspectives."
