Marjorie and her older brother Donald were raised on the farm in Malheur County. In 1938, at the age of 11, she lost her father to dust pneumonia. The small family struggled following the death of their father. This event bound the three together and instilled in them the value of family, resilience, and hard work.

attended Marjorie Adrian High School where she was involved with the school orchestra and cheerleading. While in school she met Donald Brewer (Donnie). Donnie, charming and mischievous, won her over with his persistence, repeated apologies and promises of better behavior. He kept his word (for the most part) throughout their lifetime and long marriage of 62 years. The two were married in a double ceremony with Marge's brother and his bride in

September of 1946. Donnie and Marge farmed and raised their four boys in Adrian, Oregon.
