He's released one album titled "Build" featuring various musicians that is available on Apple Music. He's working on a second album.

Also, Musselman has art on display at Royal Artisan, and will have a show there in March 2023.

Tyler Colton started writing songs for a new project in 2017, and started gathering friends to play the songs.

"We had a solidified lineup and started playing shows in 2019," he said.

"We didn't get an opportunity to tour until now — hopefully we'll be able to do a lot more in the future," Colton said.


Although the band has had a few changes to the lineup, he said Goodbye Viking now has "a really strong combination of people."

Those include Colton on guitar and vocals, Joe Hughes on drums and extra percussion, Aimee Guerin on keytar,

vocals and glockenspiel, Locke Bell on bass and vocals, and Scott Sandefur on guitar who "doesn't sing at all, but it's ok 'cause he runs around a lot on stage."

Colton loosely defines their sound as pop-punk.

"We add a lot of keyboards to our sound, and we also throw in ska and hardcore occasionally," he said. "We even have some songs with horn parts, but haven't (yet) incorporated those in
