**NEARLY THREE TONS
OF BUTTER IN ONE DAY
KAUPISCH CREAMERY
USES TWO TONS
OF SALT PER
WEEK**

In one day last week, the Kaupisch creamery turned out 5,760 pounds of butter. Nearly three tons of butter in a single day is a huge output for one establishment. The yield was the biggest day's work in the history of the Kaupisch plant. It is expected, however, that a bigger output will be made tomorrow.

The business of the establishment has grown so that approximately a ton of salt per week is used in the butter department, and another ton in the icecream department each week. Two to three tons of ice per day is consumed in the various branches of the business. Ten men are employed at the plant. The enterprise is about the biggest money disburser in the county. It did a business of \$80,000 last year and expects to reach a total of \$150,000 the current year. Though but just started, it manufactures, even in the present cool weather, an average of 100 gallons of icecream per day, a considerable portion of which is shipped and sold in neighboring towns.—Corvallis Times.

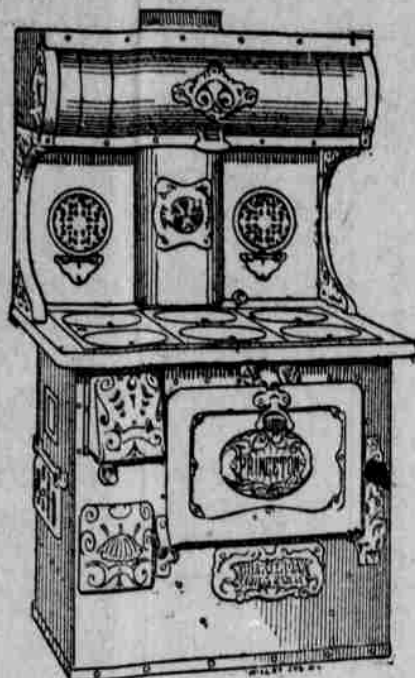
