The law is to prevent all stock from running at large in any part of the county and provides for the taking up and impounding of such stock by any person. Parties taking up such stock are required, without unnecesing up, which notice shall contain a concise description of such animals, with the marks and brands so that the owner may identify the same, and shall also state that such stock will be sold unless redeemed, giving time and place of sale, either by delivering a copy of such notice to the owner in person if residents of the county and are known to the person so taking up,
