A CIRCULAR

The following circular has been sent to Registers and Receivers of local Land offices by the Commissioner of the General Land Office at Washington, D. C:

Your attention is called to that part of the act of June 29, 1906 (34 Stats., 362), which reads as follows:

"That no notary public shall be authorized to take acknowledgments, administer oaths, certify papers or perform any official acts in connection with matters in which he is counsel, attorney or agent, or in which he may be in any way interested before any of the departments aforesaid."

Although this statute forms a part of the act of Congress amending section 558 of the Code of Law for the District of Columbia, it has recently been construed by the Attorney-General to apply to notaries outside of this District; and you are therefore directed to scrutinize all affidavits and papers filed in your office for the purpose of seeing that they are not executed in conflict with this statute.
