MRS. FRANK M. PARKER

Mary A., wife of Frank M. Parker, died Saturday evening, May 25, 1907, of heart failure at the age of 57 years, 1 month and 19 days. Mary A. Horn was born in Davis county, Iowa, April 6, 1850. She came to Jackson county, Oregon, with her parents in the early 60's, where she was married F. M. Parker on March 6, 1879, she was the mother of eight children, six of whom survive her, two sons, M. F. and Charles, and four daughters, Mrs. Jas. Fry, Mrs. Orville Brown, Mrs. Gardner and Alta.

Mrs. Parker had been ill but two weeks and was not considered in a dangerous condition until Saturday when she began to be troubled with heart failure. Physicians were called at once but nothing could be done to prevent death.

Mrs. Parker was well known as industrious woman, a faithful, loving and indulgent wife and mother. At 9:30 Tuesday morning the funeral procession left her late home, 3 miles north of Lexington, and proceeded to the Odd Fellows cemetery, followed by a large concourse of sorrowing friends, where services were held and interment made. To the bereaved husband and family the entire community extends words of sorrow and condolence.
