I am in receipt of your issue of June 13th. and note editorial entitled "A Hard Knock". I regret exceedingly friend Thomas that you should have seen fit to hand'e the Swaggart story in this manner as I have a large number of friends in your county and it might lead them to assume that I was going out of my way to give publicity to something detrimental to Morrow county. I do not believe there is any one in the state better acquainted with your county than myself and far be it from me to ever, in any way, shape or form give publicity to anything that could be assumed as a knock, because the interests of Morrow County are my interests as are those of all the counties in the state.
