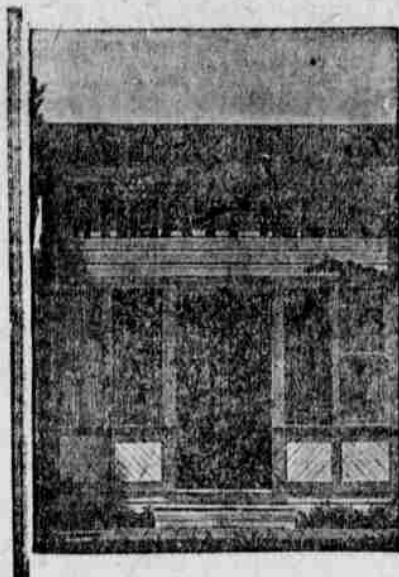
## LEXINGTON

**The Head of the Herd.**  
I would say to dairymen, buy a registered bull now. In less than three years you will be milking half blood dairy heifers, in less than five years you will have three-quarter bloods, then seven-eighths, and soon the herd will be practically pure bred and money makers. In selecting a bull to head a dairy herd one cannot be too careful. The mere fact that an animal is pure bred and registered is not enough, although very necessary. He should be from a cow that is a really first class dairy animal, and both of his granddams and still farther back should be high class producers. It will not be necessary to buy a new bull for each crop of calves. Breed the heifers to their own sire before buying a new bull. It will cost less, and the results will be better than to buy a cheap bull every two years.—W. C. Jeffries in National Stockman and Farmer.
