**For Boat Landing.**  
The following letter from Dorsey B. Smith, under date of the 7th inst., is the result of correspondence between Mr. Smith and our townsman, J. N. Mosier, regarding a boat landing at Mosier, and is most encouraging:  
Mr. Smith is General Manager of the Open River Transportation Company.  
Mr. J. N. MOSIER,  
Mosier, Ore.  
Dear Sir:  
I have your letter of March 29th and shall make it a point to call upon you and the other business men of Mosier as soon as possible. I must go to Celilo tomorrow to have steamer "Twin Cities" launched. Will make trial trip Friday, with government inspection Saturday, and must leave on trip for Pasco the first of next week.  
Captain Riggs suggested the building of five cribs at Mosier to be dove-tailed like a log cabin and filled with rock, running parallel with the river at a distance from the bank sufficient to insure landing at low water, the three center cribs to be close enough together to plank over, and the two outer cribs to be extended some distance from the other three, with planking reaching from the shore to the three center cribs. This is merely his suggestion and is given to you for your consideration.  
Will take pleasure in talking with you about this matter when I go to Mosier.
