Real Estate on the Move

George Chamberlain, one of Mosier's wide awake real estate men, reports two recent transfers of fruit land property near Mosier, which denote that real estate is on the move, and that this immediate section is fast coming into prominence as a fruit growers' paradise. One of the sales reported was 160 acres owned by the East Hood River Land Co., known as the Will Hunter place, situated a mile and a half from town. This tract was sold to A. M. Proctor, of New York City. Mr. Lelliott will have charge of the place and will make extensive improvements. The price paid for this tract was \$8,000. The other sale was that known as the Batchelder place, and owned by Frank Sweeney, of Portland. This tract was sold to Messrs Whitten & Stanly, of Portland, for \$13,000. The new owners will have the land cleared and planted to fruit trees as soon as possible.

Wanted—A Bank.

As we have stated before, there are good openings in Mosier for various lines of business. Particularly is this true of a bank. Mosier needs a bank. To a short-sighted individual it might appear that the town is too small to support a bank. Such would be the case with the town itself, but the surrounding country is far ahead of the town; that is, most of the wealth of this section is in fruit orchards, many of which are in a high state of cultivation and yield the owners handsome returns. There is money here, but it has to be deposited out of town. The claim is made that there are about \$35,000 of Mosier money deposited in the banks of Hood River and The Dalles at present, and more people are coming into the country all the time, bringing money with them. Perhaps not all this money would be withdrawn from these outside banks, but enough of it would be to insure a local bank doing a good business. Two or three parties have investigated the proposition but seemed to think the time was not quite ripe for a bank. But some one with the pioneer spirit will drop in before long and open a bank. When those parties who have investigated come back, they will find the other fellow on the ground floor, and they will have lost a good business opportunity. It is simply a question as to who will first take advantage of this opening.

Robt. W. Simpson returned on Monday from a visit with friends at The Dalles, and informed us that Ben Woods, a well known former resident of Mosier valley, went on the operating table at the Hospital Monday morning. The operation was a serious one and may have to be repeated, so the result is still in doubt, but strong hopes are entertained for his recovery.
