John Evans and Ray Sturges were Hood River visitors last Tuesday.

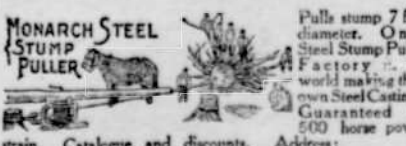
L. Lamb and W. F. Huskey paid The Dalles a business visit yesterday.
