JAIL BREAK AT THE DALLES

A bold jail break was made at The Dalles last week Thursday night, when Robbins, who murdered an old woman near Hood River, early in the summer, and a man named Wilson, up for larceny, made their escape. Their get-away was simple and well planned. It seems that they were cognizant of the fact that Sheriff Chrisman would be absent from his office between the hours of 7 and 8, Thursday evening, leaving the jailer, an old man, in sole charge of the prisoners. This was their opportunity.

When the turn-key opened the big iron door which opens directly into the sheriff's office, to admit a "trusty," who was carrying an armful of wood into the jail, Robbins and Wilson, who were concealed in the corridor, near the door, sprang forward and swung the door wide open, at the same time striking the jailer a blow on the head with a flat-billet of wood which felled him to the floor. The two prisoners then rushed to a drawer, seized a revolver and jumped out of the window and made off toward the river. In jumping from the window, however, Robbins sprained his ankle so severely that he was unable to travel fast enough to elude his pursuers, who were soon on the trail. Wilson was more fortunate, for the time being, as he got to the river, secured a plank and plunged in, intending to reach the Washington shore. The water was too rough for him and he kept along the Oregon side till he reached a section camp at Tunnel No. 3. Here he left the water and dried his clothing at the camp fire, telling the section gang all about the escape.

Sheriff Chrisman, thinking that Wilson would probably work toward Portland, drove over to Mosier, in company with deputy sheriff Gibbons, early Friday morning. They walked up the railroad, thinking they might meet him on the way. Arriving at Tunnel No. 3, they learned that Wilson had left the camp a short time before. The officers then came back to Mosier and waited until daylight. They telephoned to different ranches on the river between Mosier and The Dalles, finally getting track of him at or near the Chatfield place. They went at once to the place indicated and got their man, taking him back to The Dalles on the night train.

This unsuccessful attempt at liberty will only add to the difficulty in which these two misguided men find themselves, as the attempt is in itself a proof of guilt of the crimes of which they stand charged.

School Opens September 5th.

The Fall term of public school will open in Mosier on Monday, September 5th. As this date is a holiday, all that will be done on Monday will be to enroll the scholars. The actual school work will begin Tuesday morning. It is particularly desired by the school board and the teachers that there be a full attendance of scholars on Monday morning, especially those of the primary room and the 8th grade.
