Sunday School Convention.

The convention of the Sunday Schools of Wasco and Hood River Counties which was held in Mosier on Saturday, Sept. 25th, was a complete success in every way. Rain on the previous night had laid the dust and the weather was of the balmy type which prevails at this time of year. An even hundred delegates came from various parts of Hood River and Wasco Counties. They were distributed as follows: The Dalles, 19; Hood River, 65; Dufur, 7; Portland, 3; Boyd, 3; Cascade Locks, 1; McMinnville, 1; New York City, 1. The denominations represented were: Methodists, Christians, Baptists, Presbyterians, United Brethren, Adventist, Reformed Presbyterian. The delegates were met by a committee of young men and were escorted to the church. The Ladies Aid entertained the delegates for dinner and supper, and through their well organized efforts all were bountifully supplied; it was necessary to divide the people into two tables and this plan prevented undue crowding and confusion at the tables. The program was carried out with a few changes made necessary by delay of trains and the very few that could not come had their places filled by able speakers who seemed thoroughly prepared. HOOD RIVER-MOSIER FRUIT WELL ADVERTISED.

The New York Produce News has the following to say regarding the recent sale of the apple crop of Mosier and Hood River districts to Eastern buyers:

Steinhardt & Kelly have captured the Hood River Apple Growers' account again this year and to this they have added a purchase of the apples in the Mosier district. Jos. A. Steinhardt, senior member of the firm, who is now in the West, reports that the deal was closed at a higher figure than last year's price. Just what was paid he would not say, altho he intimated it was higher than \$2.50 a box, which was the maximum last year and which was a record price for Hood River Spitzbergers. Mr. Steinhardt said that if the crop of the combined Hood River and Mosier districts this Fall comes up to the present estimate of 150 cars at an average of 600 or 650 boxes to the car, he will pay the growers in the two valleys something in excess of \$200,000.

Mr. Steinhardt has explicit confidence in the superior qualities of the apples from these districts. His faith in them was backed up last year by a big profit and in order to introduce the consuming public to the fruit, he inaugurated an independent apple show, which occurred in New York for a week and was then moved to Philadelphia. Thousands of people visited the exhibit and went away saying they did not know so many varieties of fine eating apples were grown in America. Steinhardt & Kelly's exhibition received notice from all the daily papers, and in this way they were able to acquaint hundreds of thousands of New York consumers with the far Western fruit.
