Thousands Turn Westward.
CHICAGO, Oct. 5. — (Special)
—A large number of extra Pull-
man tourist cars have been called
into use on the Chicago, Union
Pacific and Northwestern lines
because of the unusually heavy
business which the tourist depart-
ment has handled during the col-
onists' rate season, which ends
Oct. 15. A great number of peo-
ple each year take advantage of
these rates in order to visit the
West and in a large number of
cases decide on new homes in
some of the irrigated districts or
among the fruit lands and grain
fields of Oregon, Washington
and California, but the personally
conducted feature of Pacific coast
travel which was developed
by the Northwestern and Uni-
on Pacific is said to have attract-
ed travel to an extent that has
never before been experienced.

The train service has been large-
ly expanded, and five through
trains for the Coast are now leav-
ing the Wells-street station every
day on four of which — the Los
Angeles Limited, the Oregon
Washington Limited, the Chicago
-Portland Special and the China
and Japan Fast Mail—Pullman
tourist cars are handled daily.

Changes Train Service.

Beginning next Sunday, trains
no. 11 and no. 12, on the O. R. &
N., known as the Pacific Express
and Atlantic Express respectively
will become local trains, operat-
ing between Portland and Pendle-
ton. Coincident with this change
the O. R. & N. will put on its fast
mail train between Chicago and
Portland, the latter carrying no
passengers.

The change in the through ser-
vice is for the betterment of local
traffic, considerable complaint
having been made of the failure
of the trains mentioned to keep
up to schedule.

Now that the tourist travel has
dropped off, the four through
trains a day each way will care
for the through traffic and the
other trains will be able to handle
the local business and keep to
schedule.

After the change takes place
the trains will be designated as
No. 1 and No. 2, and will make
slightly better time than hereto-
fore. The leaving time for Port-
land will remain at 8 A. M., but
Pendleton will be reached at 8:40
P. M., or 15 minutes earlier than
heretofore. No. 1 will leave Pen-
dleton at 8:40 A. M., which is the
present departing time, and will
arrive in Portland at 6:15, instead
of 6:30. The Oregon Short Line
will also put on a new local train
to take the place of the through
train eliminated between Hunt-
ington and points East. There
will be no schedules of the other
through trains on the O. R. &
N.—Oregonian.

Teach Children Self Reliance.
Self-reliance is a good lesson
to learn, and the training should
begin early. Teach the child to
feed himself, how to button his
own shoes, how to brush his hair
and wash his face, how to dress
himself properly. These things
he can very easily learn, one
thing at a time. If a child is
taught day after day to wait on
himself, it will save some trouble
in caring for him. But the
greatest gain will be in the child's
own character.

Teach him how to avoid vehicles
in crossing the street; how to get
off or on a street-car; how to do
an errand at a store and get the
right change. It is sometimes
surprising at what an early age
children can be taught these
things. If a child is taught to use
his judgment he will have judg-
ment to use. If he is never al-
lowed to use his judgment he will
suffer much for the want of it.

A boy trained to self-reliance
will find that it stands him in
good stead at school. He will sel-
dom be wanting others to do his
school work for him. He will be
a more thorough student. He
will not only be self-helpful, but
will be able to make himself use-
ful where there is need.

When the time comes for him
to go to work he will have a good
preparation to begin with. He
will have more decision of char-
acter and not be so likely to shilly-
shally about as the boy brought
up to depend wholly on "nurse"
or "papa and mamma."
Self-reliance gives a man courage
to hold firm, to be cool and col-
lected under trying circum-
stances. The self-reliant man
seldom becomes a public burden.
"He is most powerful who has
himself in his power."—Milwau-
kee Journal.
