

FARMERS FLOCK TO CANADA

Fully 70,000 American Settlers Have Crossed Border.

Winnipeg, Man., Oct. 5 .- American farmers by the tens of thousands are now pouring over the boundary into the Canadian West. According to a state-70,000 for the present year.

In the beginning of this acrossdary movement the newcomers were largely from the Middle states, but this year they are coming from almost ev-ery state in the Union. Not only is the quantity satisfactory to Canada, the bill. but the quality of settlers is rather improving than otherwise.

Practically, the official report says

60,000 Americans this season entered Canada, and every man, woman and child was possessed on an average of \$1,000 in stock, cash and effects, meaning that they brought into this country nearly \$60,000,000.


