HOOD RIVER APPLE FAIR

Unqualified Success—Most Remarkable Display Ever Seen in Valley—Mosier Fruit Center of Attraction.

The best, biggest, and most successful pomological exhibition ever held in that county ended at Hood River Saturday evening. Thousands of visitors from every direction poured into the city, Saturday being the banner day, with the vast display rooms in the opera house being packed from morning till night by sight-seers.

A mere pen picture cannot depict the magnitude and beauty of the display. Six hundred and ninety boxes were on exhibition, among which Spitzenbergs, Newtowns and Jonathans were most prominent. The fruit, well selected, was packed in an artistic manner, and each box was placed in such a position as to command equal prominence with its neighbors.

The display from the Mosier district was near the center of the main room, and at all hours of the day was among the principal features of attraction of a critical crowd. This exhibit was greatly admired by all, and one box of Spitzenbergs, of a 45 grade, packed by George Carroll, was conceded by many experts to be the peer of any in the building. This box, it was thought, would have taken the first prize, and ranked at the very head of its 689 competitors.

While Mosier modestly refrained from entering the competitive lists and made no bid for prizes this year, her star of glory and honor is still in the ascendant, and has proven, and will prove, that her place on the horticultural map is second to none in the great fruit domain of the northwest.

Saturday afternoon the blue ribbons were placed on the prize winners. Prof. H. E. Van Deman acted as judge on all points except pack, and A. P. Bateham refereed the pack.

A feature of the general display was a table upon which were posed some of the most magnificent rosy cheeked apples ever seen in Oregon. They were the Wolf River variety, exhibited by N. W. Bone. One enormous specimen tipped the scale at 37 1-2 ounces, and had a circumference of 18 1-2 inches.

In another corner of the main room was a display of freak apples, each with from two to three calyx ends. These were probably no novelty to horticulturists, but to lay persons from the urban centers they seemed remarkable.

A carload will be made up of the more choice boxes and entered for display at the apple congress to be held at Chicago

the latter part of this month and the early part of December. A portion of the Mosier exhibit will be represented, although it is a Hood River project. The floor space for this exhibit will cost our neighboring association \$1800 and it is considered money well invested as an advertising idea.

Too much praise and credit cannot be given the officers of the fair association, for their unprecedented success, and for the uniform courtesy extended to all visitors. Strangers were made to feel at home, and at every hand was to be found an attaché, ever willing to vouchsafe information to those who desired it.

It was a splendid show, and a recurrence next year is already looked forward to by all with eager anticipation.
