EDITOR BULLETIN: In closely settled communities like Mosier or Hood River or White Salmon, the center of interest is in the country and not in the town.

It was, as I take it, merely a recognition of this fact that has led so many localities on the Pacific Coast to adopt the use of the word "Valley" in trying to get a word that would be comprehensive and, while embracing both town and country, still give the deserved prominence to the country.

As has been well said, the use of the word "Valley" here is misleading and leads directly away from thought of the most valuable and characteristic feature of the topography of our country, which is its hills.

In all the world I do not believe there is another spot that combines such rare scenic beauty, such health-giving air, such pure water and such wealth from its fruit products, as on the beautiful "Mosier Hills."

As I understand it, the move to substitute the word "Hills" for "Valley" is an advertising stunt in the publicity campaign of the Commercial Club, calculated to bring forward the strongest features of the country and at the same time have a different sound and appearance from the thousand-and-one "valleys" that are trying to catch the ears or eyes of the hosts of people who want new and better homes.

People of discernment all know that mountain or hill fruit is the best keeping and finest grade produced. Advertise the fact that all our fruit is of that class. In all cities the best residence portions are on the Hills and Heights. It is a universal desire to live where air and view are the best.

Advertise that in the succession of undulating hills which rise terrace on terrace for miles and miles away to the foothills of Mt. Hood, "Mosier Hills" offer the finest COUNTRY HOMES for COUNTRY GENTLEMEN that the world affords.

All of this beauty of nature is backed up by the solid profits that accrue from orchards that are on right soil and rightly situated on hills which in themselves produce the conditions which add the extra fine touches to the perfect fruit of Mosier.

Any one who would thoughtlessly be led to try and apologize for the existence of hills here would make a mistake. The people of Mosier should and do glory in them. Every farm has beautiful building sites, each with a different vista. The infinite variety of panoramic view is one of the charms of the country for which we love it.

Mosier Fruit Land Selling Higher

Mosier fruitlands are moving along in the procession to higher prices and this district bids fair to soon get into the \$1000 an acre class. Through B. E. Duncan & Co., ten acres of two year old trees were sold last week to Edward M. Strauss, a wealthy clothier of Ripon, Wis., for \$350 per acre.

Another tract of 20 acres in the same locality was bought by O. L. Craton, of Hood River, from the Davenport heirs, for \$2000. This is raw fruit land and will be developed at once. The sale was made through the agency of Devlin & Firebaugh. Through the same agency Homer L. Mumford purchased a ten acre tract of developed fruit land located three-quarters of a mile southwest of Mosier in what is known as the Mosier orchard belt.
