FACTS ABOUT OREGON.

[Old news but new to many.]
OREGON—

Has one-sixth the standing timber of the United States, or any other state. Government estimate, three hundred billion feet.

A vast undeveloped area now available to the home-maker and investor will go on the market this year.

Has arable land enough for twenty million people. Present population, 700,000.

Does more than any other state to advance irrigation, being the largest contributor to the United States Reclamation Fund.

Is natural dairying state. Annual product, \$17,000,000, an increase from \$5,000,000 five years ago. Western portion has pasture every month in the year.

Ranks second in wool clip among the states.

Oregon apples, pears and cherries find their way to the tables of sovereigns and multi-millionaires of every civilized land—they are the best. Returns of from \$900 to \$1000 per acre on fruit lands are not exceptional.

Poultry products, \$5,900,000 annually. Local market demands three times that amount at higher prices.

Its water powers (being rapidly developed) sufficient to run all the machinery in the United States.

Livestock in state estimated at \$75,000,000—packing plants now building insure a trebled market.

Has two prosperous mining sections, located in the eastern and southeastern portions of the state—gold, silver, iron, copper and oil among the products.

Has diversity of climates and soils suited to every product of the temperate zone not dependent upon hot nights.

In fact, there is no better section in the United States for the homeseeker, the manufacturer, the capitalist or those who would become capitalists, the miner, lumberman, dairyman, stockman, fruitman, the invalid or pleasure seeker, or for any person wishing to engage in any kind of labor, trade or profession, than OREGON.

Oregon banks showed a remarkably healthy condition, according to the report of State Bank Examiner Steel. Assets and liabilities of the private and national banks of the state at the close of business on November 16 are compared with the same statistics on November 27, 1908, much to the disadvantage of the earlier date. An increase of 21 per cent in loans and discounts and individual deposits is shown for the current year. Individual deposits in banks have increased \$16,193,978 over last year, certainly a strong evidence of the prosperity of the state. A gain of more than \$1,000,000 in resources of the banks in a single year is a striking proof of the advance Oregon has made during the past twelve months. This is partly due to the marketing of a large lumber cut, but the high prices at which the agricultural staples were marketed

had an even stronger effect on the figures. There has also been a great amount of money brought into Oregon during the past year by new settlers. This has gone into farm lands, timber and city property. Railroad activity now going forward in the state will undoubtedly have a strong effect in bringing the coming year's showing up to an even higher level than that disclosed in the latest report.—Hood River News

THE FRENCH PEOPLE
