Big investments are also being made in the Rogue and Umpqua valleys.

The apple fairs held in our s ate, during the past year, were of unusual merit, notwithstanding he unprecedented shortness of the apple crop throughout the Torch vest.

Many orehard-planting syndicate; have been organized, most of whose holdings are in Western Ocegon. The acreage of those companies runs from 300 to 3000 acres, and will be devoted large'y to apples.
