Another Big Transfer of Mosier Land.

John P. Ross, who came here three months ago from Florida and bought a 12-acre orchard one mile from town, of Ira Evans, has just purchased of the East Hood River Land Co. a tract of 160 acres lying two and a half miles southwest of Mosier in the heart of one of the finest bodies of fruit land in the Mosier District. The purchase price was \$16000.

Mr. Ross has some associates in the latter purchase and it is the intention to organize a corporation to handle and improve this valuable tract. A portion of it may be subdivided.

Other sales made this week were those of 20 acres of apple land, owned by Mr. Jacobson, of The Dalles and sold to Dr. Eleshman, of Portland, and a 25-acre tract belonging to J. R. Huskey, which was purchased by Dr. Chas. Billington, of Portland. These sales were all made thru the agency of George Chamberlain, one of Mosier's leading real estate men.

Dr. C. Templeton sold his place this week, consisting of eighty acres, to the East Hood River Land Co. The place is partially improved and the new owners will put about 20 acres more in trees this Spring.

J. J. Smith, of Portland, will put out 6 acres of apple trees on his Grand View place, which is in charge of Grant Hinckle.

C. J. Phillips expects to set out at least 4 acres of trees this Spring.

John Miller will put out several acres to trees on his place.

Arthur Kuhn will put down a concrete and cement cistern and build a barn this Summer.
