A YEARLING.

With this issue the BULLETIN starts on its second year of existence. At its birth we gave as an excuse for its existence our desire to assist in boosting the town of Mosier and Mosier District. This we have endeavored to do. Much more is generally expected of a newspaper in the way of boosting and write-ups than of the average citizen who reads the paper, no matter how much the latter may be interested in the growth of his community. We have an abiding faith in the future of Mosier and a friendly feeling for its citizens. Altho having lived here a year, we cannot say that we know any more about the fruit business than when we came, having employed our energy in "crowding many good things out of the paper." However, if it is possible to secure the articles desired in no other way, we will buy them, in order to give our readers what they want.

In beginning this second year, we wish to thank our readers for their patronage during the past year and to assure them that if we have been remiss in any of our journalistic duties, it will be our effort in the future to correct those faults. We also extend a hearty invitation to all to co-operate with us in our endeavor to Boost Mosier.

sands of prospective home seekers all over the United States. This booklet, of course, cost money. It is the desire of the Club to continue this publicity campaign, but without sufficient funds it will be impossible to carry out this plan to the full extent. It is therefore desirable—nay, urgent, that every resident of Mosier District, every individual who has property or business interests here, should get in line—get the boosting habit—put his shoulder to the wheel and PUSH for MOSIER.

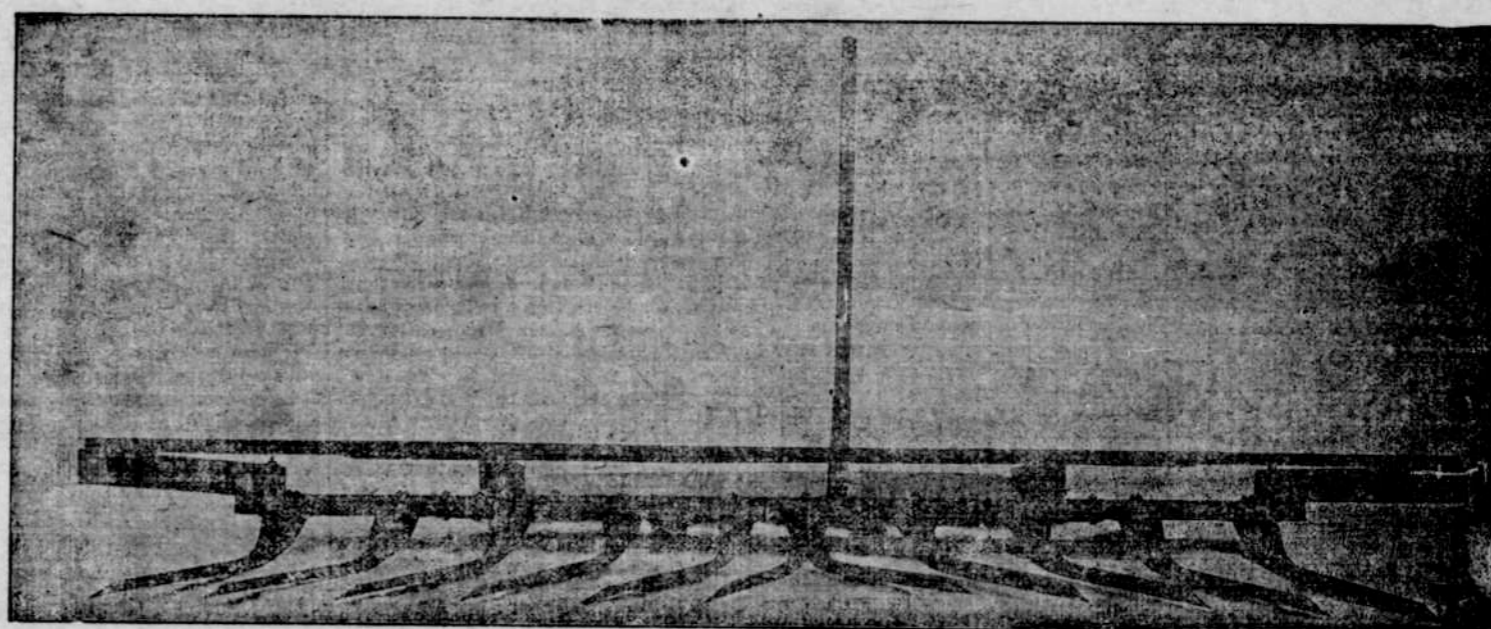
