This land, which will be known as the "Mountain View Orchard Tract," is particularly well adapted to the raising of fine apples, as it has sufficient altitude to give the fruit that color, flavor and excellent keeping qualities for which Mosier is so justly famous. The land will be subdivided into ten and twenty acre tracts and will be put on the market at once. These tracts will be sold on the easy payment plan, so that the small investor or the wage earner may acquire land without straining his credit or his pocketbook. 
