**IMPORTANCE of GOOD ROADS.**

The question of good roads in a community is of vital importance. No section can enjoy much prosperity or comfort without them. Everyone wants them, but not everyone is willing to bear the expense to get them. They cannot be built without money, whether obtained from the county and state road fund or by private subscription, or both. But roads—good roads—we must have, if this country is to be properly developed. We have most everything else in Mosier that any reasonable being could ask for BUT GOOD ROADS. We know it alright, and land buyers know it, too, when they come here and are taken into the country. It is a fact that several parties have come to Mosier with the intention of purchasing land, but because of the condition of our roads they have gone away without investing, and wondering why, if the people here are so anxious to build up the country, they do not adopt measures best calculated to do it—improve the roads. Strangers do not know what a small amount of money we have to expend, or how many miles of county road there are to keep up in the district. Even some of the residents here do not realize it, and oftentimes the road supervisors are unjustly censured for not keeping the roads in better condition.

It will be asked, then, how we expect to keep the present roads in good repair and build new ones, when the funds obtainable are so insufficient. This may be done by one or all of three ways: By obtaining a larger appropriation from the county and state; by special road tax, and by private subscription, payable in cash or labor. Surely, every individual who uses a road, either for driving or walking over, is interested in keeping that road in good condition for his own benefit, and because he knows it enhances the value of every foot of land he may own, as well as his neighbor. The progressive, up-to-date farmer wants good roads that he may the more easily and safely market his produce. The merchant wants good roads that the farmer may deliver his produce in better condition. The real estate man wants good roads that he may conduct his prospective customers through the country in a comfortable and pleasant manner while showing his bargains in Mosier real estate. We ALL want good roads because we know that they are most necessary in building up a new country.

Judge Webster, probably the best authority and most ardent exponent of good roads in the West, will speak at the booster meeting of the Commercial Club to be held on May 14th., and his subject will be "Good Roads." It is earnestly hoped that every man in the Mosier district will be present and hear what he has to say on this most vital interesting subject.

**LEST WE FORGET.**

Let us remember the booster meeting to be held on the evening of May 14th. It is desired by the officers of the Commercial Club that all the citizens who are interested in the present and future prosperity of Mosier District, and who are willing to work for that prosperity, that they should attend to a man. Think about it and talk to your neighbors about it during the coming week. Make up your mind that you will support the movement with your presence, your membership and your money, according to your ability.

This meeting, to be held in Stroup's Hall, will be attended by a number of prominent Portland men who are actively interested in the general prosperity of every section of the state. By their willingness to come to Mosier on this occasion they prove their interest in us. Let us all manifest our appreciation of this interest by a full attendance of the citizens of the district. Con-

vince them of our own interest and faith in our section and they will convince others.

It is understood, of course, that this is, primarily, a business meeting, where subjects of vital importance to the community will be discussed. However, the social aspect will not be overlooked and the occasion will afford the people, especially the new comer, an opportunity to mingle and get acquainted with his neighbors and incidentally to join the commercial club, so we can all work to better purpose.

The ladies of the Civic Improvement League will serve refreshments and the ladies of the families of members and all others who are sufficiently interested to attend, are cordially invited to be present. As the subjects to be discussed at this meeting will be of no particular interest to children and young people, they will not be expected to attend, this not being a juvenile party. The young folks can enjoy themselves elsewhere, and it is hoped that parents can make arrangements to leave their children in good hands so they may attend the meeting.

**A GOOD IDEA.**

The Dalles Chronicle says that one of the first moves made by the new secretary of the Business Men's Association, Judd S. Fish, is the recommendation that a building be constructed and a suitable display of fruit, vegetables and grains be made at the O. R. & N. depot. This plan of advertising has been used for years by the various cities along the railroads, and it is being followed at Hood River.

The plan is to build a small structure large enough so that the secretary could also make it his office during the summer season, to make a full display of the products of Wasco county, and have a full line of literature on hand for distribution to travelers. The trains stop for several minutes at the station and it would afford an opportunity for those who so desired to view the display and get literature. It would also give the secretary an opportunity to get a good mailing list, to have all travelers who are interested register their names and addresses.

Some people have suggested that the depot display plan does not properly reach the people, but this argument is not good as, if it were not a good thing, Hood River, La Grande, Mosier and the larger towns of the Willamette Valley which have long experience in the publicity business would not be using it. It is a good thing to use every reasonable means to bring this section to the notice of the travelling public. Secretary Fish says that the cost of the building and display would be nominal and that the same is well worth trying. As it is now, only about one stranger in ten visits the rooms of the Business Men's Association in their present location.
