The Oregonian says that Tom Richardson has tendered his resignation as publicity manager of the Portland Commercial Club and secretary of the Oregon Development League, to become effective June 30. ### McCann Shoots Himself.

H. L. McCann, principal of the Gilliam County High School, at Condon, committed suicide last Monday by shooting himself in the head. His body was found at a deserted cabin in a canyon five miles from Condon.

McCann, who is a married man 51 years old with three grown children, appears to have attempted undue familiarity with some of the girl students, who informed their parents. Fearing the disgrace which exposure would bring to his hitherto untarnished name, McCann took his life.

Prof. McCann was known here in Mosier. He purchased ten acres of fruit land here last Fall and spent about two weeks in Mosier and Hood River.

### Buys Duvall Property.

George Sellinger, whose temporary home has been at Cascade Locks since he sold his ranch near town, was in town the first of the week and while here he purchased the D. M. Duvall residence. Mr. Sellinger will move back to Mosier as soon as Mr. Duvall can vacate, which will largely depend on the condition of his young son, Guy, who is at present sick with pneumonia.

Mr. Sellinger, who has lived in this community so many years, wanted to remain here after selling his ranch, but at the time it was impossible for him to secure a house and he was forced to go to Cascade Locks and wait until he could buy or rent here. By this deal he has secured a very desirable town residence, from which a beautiful view of the Columbia may be had.

### MOSIER-HUSUM GAME.

The Mosier ball twirlers "got it in the neck" again, last Sunday, when they went to Husum and lost out by a score of 7 to 10. Mosier was in the lead up to the 7th inning, the score being 4 to 6.
