Everyone, big and little, old and young, has the true public spirit. The Rose Festival this year is bigger, better and more beautiful than ever. It is apparently the effort of the committee to make each festival better in every respect than the one before it, and they are succeeding beyond their most sanguine hopes.

This public spirit is contagious—everyone gets it, not only the citizens, but the stranger within the gates is imbued with it and nothing but praise and admiration is heard on every hand for the magnificent decorations of public and private buildings and the beautiful display of roses.

OREGON A LAW-MAKING CURIO.

New York Newspaper Asks How Long People's Patience Will Last.

Is there no limit to the patience and industry of the Oregon voter? At the last election he had to pass upon a score of legislative proposals after digesting a book as big as a "best seller" setting forth their merits and demerits. That was only an appetizer, so to speak. This year he will have about 30 proposals before him.

The Oregon people are only just learning to use the initiative, and there appears to be a tendency in every group or locality which has some project at heart that would be hopeless before the Legislature, to submit it to the whole people of the state. Normal schools are initiating bills to revive themselves in three different towns. Five new counties are trying to carve themselves out of existing counties. There is an employer's liability measure urged by the labor unions to be submitted to the people; also a measure to create "people's inspectors," whatever they may be; another for the payment of expenses of delegates to the National conventions by the taxpayers, and another providing for the selection of such delegates and of Presidential electors at direct primaries. We take our hat off to the popular legislators of Oregon. If they keep up their interest they will soon vote on election day upon as many bills as come before a Legislature in a session, and the voter's guide on legislative proposals will be as big as an unabridged dictionary.

Two bills prohibiting the government manufacture of stamped envelopes are before congress.

The druggists, manufacturers and the printers throughout the country are getting together on the proposition. They can't see anything fair about the government furnishing envelopes at cost and not doing the same with beefsteak or fish cakes.—American Bulletin.

OUR PORTLAND LETTER.

Portland, Ore., June 7. (Special) Portland is host this week for thousands of visitors from all parts of the country who are in attendance at the annual Rose Festival. Never before did Portland look as handsome, the extensive decorations put up generally about the city being unusually elaborate. The attendance is greater than at any former festival and the parades are outdoing anything previously attempted.

Business cares are generally being relegated during the week. The people of the city are devoting their attention to entertaining out of town visitors and are participating in the week's festivities to the fullest extent. As usual, the parades and the competitive rose show are the big events, attracting the most attention. Many people of the Northwest visit Portland during the Rose Festival if at no other time during the year and to these, the tremendous growth of the city during the past year is more impressive even than the Festival pageants. The city's progress merely reflects the general prosperity of the Pacific Northwest and is increasing in population and wealth because the same is true of the tributary country.

Uncertainty surrounding the future of the annual fair and livestock show on the Country Club grounds near this city was dispelled during the week when stockholders decided to continue the organization. The usual exposition will be held this fall. The Portland Fair and Livestock Association has not yet become a money maker and some doubted that the annual show and racing meet would be continued. Special meeting of stockholders was held to consider this question and it was decided to not allow the project to lapse. Big plans are being made for the coming show this fall, and it is the intention of those behind the affair to make it as big an attraction for that season of the year as the Rose Festival is in the Spring. It will certainly be a great benefit for the whole Northwest to have the livestock show, continued annually.

An Oregon shingle mill in Tillamook County worked 23 days on one mammoth cedar log, cutting from it 141,000 shingles. This is almost unbelievable to people not familiar with the Pacific Coast where big trees and vast timber resources are accepted quite as a matter of course.

service between Portland and Chicago has been established via the North Bank road. The new train having a running time of 72 hours, the same as the North Coast Limited. A readjustment of the time schedules on the Northern Pacific line between Portland and Seattle, allowing for a joint use of the track by the Oregon & Washington, the new Harriman line, will be made within a few days. The O. R. & N. Co. will run a farming demonstration train through Southeastern Washington, starting from Colfax June 20, and ending the trip at Pomeroy on June 25. During the journey 22 stops of about two hours each will be made. Professors from the staff of the State College at Pullman will accompany the train and deliver lectures on improved farming methods. Residents of the sections of Washington to be visited are much interested in the coming trip.
