Good Climbing Up Mt. Hood Summit

Found, between the hour of sun set and sun rise a golden opportunity, an opportunity that every person should grasp if possible.

There was quite a stir among the residents of Bear Willow Farm on the morning of Tuesday, August 2d, 1910. All were astir at two a. m. and by three ready for the much anticipated camping trip to Mt. Hood...

We left Mosier on Tuesday for Mt. Hood, with a firm determination to ascend the mountain if possible. All day in the hot sun, stopping at 8 a. m. for breakfast, over some rough roads, sometimes almost unable to breathe for the dust, we pushed forward determined to accomplish the object of our trip...

Thursday morning there was quite a stir. The cook was up early and soon had breakfast, but was informed by the guide that the wind was too strong, and to wait until the next day was his request.

Waiting in camp is irksome, so off to Cooper's Spur on the glacier was the order of the day. The climb to the Spur is laborious, toilsome and tedious, being three miles from the Inn on rock all the way...

Friday, August 5th, three of the party presented themselves at the Inn for final preparations to climb the mountain. The first thing done was to black the face
