SHEPHERDS OF PALESTINE.
A Life Which is Almost Ideal in Its Peace and Quietude.
The pastoral life of the Palestine peasant has always been a subject of interest and a pleasant study. The shepherd is seen at his best in the spring, when he has the care of both sheep and lambs and when all his thoughts are centered on his seemingly idyllic occupation.
Work for the shepherd begins in earnest with the lambing season, which commences early in January and continues for two or three months. During that time it is no unusual sight to see the shepherd with several newly born lambs or kids stored away in the capacious folds of his bosom and the mothers in close attendance.
When heavy storms of snow or rain come on the shelter of some cave has to be sought and a careful watch against the attacks of wild animals kept. This watchfulness is not relaxed on a fine day, and the long hours on the hillsides or plains are whiled away in making music on the reed lute, of which every shepherd is the maker and player.
The music is an assurance to the sheep that the shepherd is on the alert. Let the music cease for any length of time and the flock will stop grazing and look around for their caretaker and leader. At night the sheep are folded around the village or camp to which they belong. The fold is a large enclosure, the wall of which is made up of good sized stones piled one on another. There is only one entrance, which is narrow, for the sheep as they enter have to "pass under the rod" so that the owner may count them and see that none are missing.
To find good pasture and a quiet resting place is the daily duty of the shepherd, and in the long summer days the flock rests during the heat by some stream or under the shadow of a great rock. Each sheep has its name, to which it will respond on being called by its keeper. In southern Palestine the flocks are tended by girls and women, but in other parts by youths and men.

Curtiss, Mars, Ely and Baldwin will compete.

THANKSGIVING PROCLAMATION
President Taft Names Thursday, November 24.
Last Year's Great Progress in America is Notable, and Causes for Thankfulness are Many.
Washington—The progress of the country as reflected by the records of population and harvests and the general conditions of international peace, are things for which thanksgiving is especially due for the year 1910, according to the annual Thanksgiving proclamation issued by President Taft. The proclamation is as follows:
"This year of 1910 is drawing to a close. The records of population and harvests which are the index of progress show vigorous national growth and the health and prosperous well-being of our communities throughout this land and in our possessions beyond the seas. These blessings have not descended upon us in restricted measure, but overflow and abound. They are the blessings and bounty of God.
"We continue to be at peace with the rest of the world. In all essential matters our relations with other peoples are harmonious with an ever-growing reality of friendliness and depth of recognition of mutual dependence. It is especially to be noted that during the last year great progress has been achieved in the cause of arbitration, and the peaceful settlement of international disputes.
"Now, therefore, I, William Howard Taft, president of the United States of America, in accordance with the wise custom of the civil magistrate since the first settlements in this land, and with the rule established from the foundation of this government, do appoint Thursday, November 24, 1910, as a day of national thanksgiving and prayer, enjoying the people upon that day to assist in their churches for the praise of Almighty God and to return heartfelt thanks to him for all his goodness and loving kindness.
"In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed.
"Done at the City of Washington, this 5th day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ten, and of the independence of the United States one hundred and thirty-fifth. (Signed) "WILLIAM HOWARD TAFT."

New York—Christy Mathewson has just signed a contract with the New York baseball club for next season at the highest salary ever paid in the history of the game. It is understood that Mathewson will receive for his services next season \$15,000.
The "big six" had a long conference with John T. Brush, and while the financial dealings of the club with its players are never made public, it is said on good authority that Mr. Brush volunteered Mathewson the advance in salary.

Nicaragua Wants Loan.
Managua—In the convention signed by the United States Commissioner Dawson, on the one hand, and General Estrada and his ministers on the other, for the continuance of Estrada in the presidency for two years, Mr. Dawson promises to use his best efforts to obtain a loan for Nicaragua from the United States. This loan is to be guaranteed by 50 per cent of the customs duties, and will be used for the purpose of funding the internal and foreign debt, building railroads and establishing a gold standard.

Drinking Cups Under Ban.
Sacramento—The State board of health has decided to press more closely its campaign against public drinking cups by adopting a resolution asking all railroad companies to remove cups from cars, depots and ferries and to have public and private schools use other methods for children, either individual cups or drinking fountains. The health board points out that many states have passed laws prohibiting the use of drinking cups for the general public on account of dangers of spreading contagious diseases.
