Portland, Ore. Dec. 27, (Special) That Oregon will have a population of 1,200,000 when the next census rolls round is the prediction of R. B. Miller, traffic manager of the Harriman lines in the Northwest. He bases his figures on the constant western trend of population as disclosed by former census statistics.

He estimates that the United States will have a nopulation of 113,000,000. 
