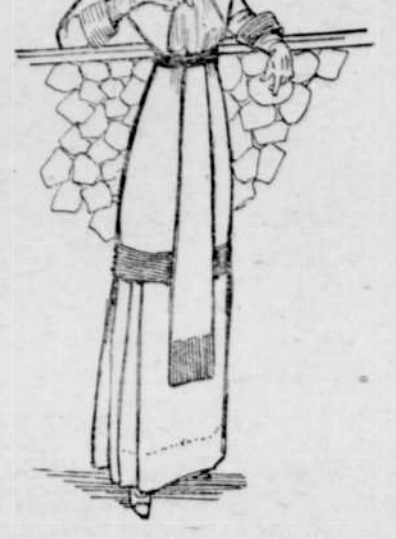

EXPERIMENT STATION NOTES.
There has recently come under the observation of the Washington Experiment Station at Pullman, a "borer," present chiefly in the timbered districts where it has attacked the young orchards. Describing this pest and prescribing treatment, Prof. A. L. Melander of the Washington experiment station says:

"This pest is produced by a blackish beetle about one-half an inch in length that flies during the latter part of the summer. An egg is placed on each tree, the borer hatching from it in time killing the young trees. These borers probably live several years in the trees and the larger ones, at least, will enter into the heart wood to pass the winter. If the trees are small, there is little hope of their recovery, and the trees may as well be reset. The pest is native to our pine timber, but seems to be also found of young orchards. The best treatment is in the way of prevention. Spray a thorough coating of sulphur on the lower trunks of the trees next June, repeating this, if necessary, so as to keep the trunks coated throughout the summer. The sulphur acts as a deterrent to the borer, and protects the trees from the egg laying habit of the beetle."

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Why is there such a dread of outdoor air in the sleeping room? Science has made great advances in hygiene. In many hospitals children suffering from diseases of the respiratory system are taken up to cots on roofs and there allowed to breathe the open air. Open air and tent life are part of the recognized treatment of tuberculosis nowadays.

Birds Fond of Russian Mulberry.

REBELS BECOME MORE ACTIVE.
El Paso, Texas.—Activity of the rebels in Mexico is spreading following the battle Wednesday near Montezuma, which was confirmed in messages which reached here today. Ten rebels were taken prisoners, along with 17 pack mules and a large quantity of ammunition. Other bands of insurgents have been seen. Troops are now being rushed to the south border of Arizona. Two troops of cavalry were sent into the mountains near Tombstone, capturing a supply of contraband goods and rebel ammunition.

Big Rush to Plead Guilty.
West Union, Ohio.—West Union is overflowing with citizens of Adams county who are waiting for a chance to plead guilty to charges of selling their votes. Wagon load after wagon load of voters under indictment poured into the city during the day. As fast as their cases were called they admitted their guilt, were disfranchised for a period of five years and were fined insignificant amounts. Meanwhile the indictment mill is steadily at work and it is expected that at least 150 more true bills will be returned.

Rebel Prisoners to Be Tried.
Parral, Mexico.—Thirty-eight rebel prisoners, guarded by 60 soldiers, were taken from here to Chihuahua yesterday for trial. Two hundred soldiers sent into the mountains after rebels sent back five prisoners this week, and reported, according to the jefe politico, Rodolfo Valles, that "the insurgents are racing madly for the state of Sonora, with troops in hot pursuit." Fifty men are stationed on top of hills overlooking this city.

Farman Wins Great Prize.
