ANNUAL SCHOOL MEETING

We are in receipt of a folder sent by L. R. Alderman, Superintendent of Public Instruction, announcing next Monday, June 19, as Annual School Meeting Day.

Mosier has good reason to be proud of her school, and while there are perhaps many things to be desired, we are ahead of many other schools in some things.

At this meeting, a director will be elected to serve three years, and a clerk to serve one year. As the election of a director should be a matter of consideration and judgment, it is urgently desired that the school voters of the district turn out in full force and select one among them who will take as much interest in the welfare of the school as the outgoing director.

Mrs. Amy L. Gove, who has been Principal of the Mosier school for the past three terms, and who has done excellent work all thru, being conscientious and painstaking to a degree, was re-elected to serve another term, but resigned for good and sufficient reasons, and the board has secured the services of an instructor who comes with the highest recommendations.

OUR PORTLAND LETTER

PORTLAND, ORE., June 13.—That this will be the biggest year that Oregon has ever known, with the biggest crop total in its history, is the prediction made by Dr. James Withycombe, director of the United States Experiment Station at Corvallis.

Loggers of the Columbia River Basin will go to Vancouver, B. C. to attend the third annual Logging Congress to be held there June 22-23. The conditions that obtain in this industry will be discussed thoroughly and all matters of interest to timbermen will be taken up.

German-speaking societies of this city have raised a fund to be used in connection with a sum provided by the Commercial Club

to be expended in attracting German immigration to Oregon. It is planned to vote the money to the publication of German booklets, telling of the advantages Oregon offers to the settler and in answering letters of inquiry in the German language.

Oregon's newly formed Naval Reserve will have a flagship before the end of the month for United States Cruiser Boston has been ordered transferred to duty at Portland and will be brought here during the coming week by the officers of this organization.

Portland now claims to have the fastest motor boat in the world, the Oregon Wolf having just been launched, and it made its first appearance at races ran during the Rose Festival.

Bankers of the state have been in session in Portland the past week and they say never before has banking been in such a satisfactory condition in Oregon.

With an interest in, and an eye open to the general welfare of Mosier, the Rev. K. H. Sickafosse suggests the feasibility of starting a gymnasium in Mosier.

WEARING AWAY OF MOTHER EARTH

Investigation by the United States Geological Survey of the erosion of numerous drainage basins of the United States show that the surface of the country is being removed at the average rate of about an inch in 760 years.

Though this amount seems trivial when spread over the surface of the country, it becomes stupendous when considered as a total, or even in separate drainage basins. Mississippi River, for instance, carries annually to the sea 136,400,000 tons of dissolved matter and 340,500,000 tons of suspended matter, and of this total Ohio River carries 33,350,000 tons and Missouri River contributes more than twice as much.
